PREVENTION OF BITES

PREVENTION IS BETTER THAN CURE "STOP BITES BEFORE THEY HAPPEN"

Dogs don't understand that bitting you is wrong. Often dogs bite if they are scared or trying to protect themselves. In order to avoid being bitten by dogs, we need to understand:

- How dogs are feeling
- How to approach dogs safely
- . When it is safe and not safe to approach or interact with dogs

By understanding dog behaviour and avoiding dangerous situations, we can avoid being bitten.

WHAT IS RABIES?

Rabies is a virus that affects only mammals and most commonly occurs in dogs. As the virus lives in saliva of infected mammals, it enters the body of healthy animals and people following bites or the licking of scratches and wounds. The virus causes death if left untreated.

We can prevent this killer disease by keeping our animals vaccinated against rabies.

We must try to prevent rabies with vaccination! Once the symptoms of rabies appear, we cannot treat if,


There are 3 simple steps to prevent rables:

- 1. Avoid getting bitten by any animal.
- If bitten, wash the wound immediately with running water and soap for 15 minutes.
- Tell an adult you have been bitten, because they must take you to a clinic or hospital for a rables vaccination.

NOTE:

If you cannot find an adult to accompany you, go with a friend as it is very important that you get help.

Post workshop activities: deliverables (> sept 2014)



- 12 pilot rabies investigation programs written
- 8 manuscripts completed (2 submitted for publication)
- National plan for the control and surveillance of rabies in Senegal
- 9 training sessions of health professionals (at the local or provincial level) and already 3 at the national level (Madagascar, South Africa, Ivory Coast).
- 2 national meetings grouping the different partners and ministries and promoting the one health approach in rabies control (Madagascar and in South Africa)
- Documents prepared and distributed in South Africa, Madagascar and Algeria.
- 205 messages and documents have been exchanged using the forum of the web site
- Further training followed 3 trainees



COLT: a paradigm shift in the concept of teaching neglected and zoonotic diseases

- A unique opportunity for mixing experience and knowledge between international, experts on rabies and a very motivated group of students
- Provide high quality education material to young talent in public health in developing countries
- Large mentoring efforts developed before, during and after the workshop by the management and teaching team (helped by facilities developed in the framework of COLT)
- Promotes leadership among a young generation of educated and responsible health researchers and managers
- Builds a regional/continental community

Coordinated Approach to Education

GARC Education Platform was established after the need for a coordinated approach to rabies education was recognized



- The GARC Education Platform is a web domain where various online courses will be hosted.
- Some courses will be open to all participants, while others will be for specific professions.
- To date, one course (the Rabies Educator Certificate) has been developed and is live on the website: <u>http://education.rabiesalliance.org</u>



The Rabies Educator Certificate (REC) program is a free online course for community educators, public health workers and anyone interested in learning how to prevent rabies in their communities.



The course will teach participants:

- about rabies
- how it is caused
- how to prevent this disease



- Humane treatment of animals
- and how to communicate this life-saving information to people in their community.



 The REC Program relies on 5 modules - each with specific contents pertaining to rabies and its prevention



REC is:

- can be downloaded and studied offline (for those with slow or intermittent internet access)

REC consists of five modules applicable to all situations, regardless of geographical location and circumstances:

- 6) What is rabies and how do people and animals get the disease?
- 7) How to avoid dog bites and prevent rabies
- 8) Caring for animals
- 9) Understanding the role of a community educator in preventing dog bites and rabies
- 10) Communicating with people

On passing a final online assessment, participants receive a Certificate of Achievement and should be ready to provide lifesaving information to their target communities.

 Humane animal handling and proper administration of vaccine are essential techniques that need to be cultivated and refined by all people actively involved with dog handling and vaccination



Addition to the GARC Education Platform

• GARC envisions the launch of a new course

"Animal Handler and Vaccinator Education Certificate (AHVEC)"

 The new course will be a profession-specific course teaching very specific information to professionals that are involved with routine dog vaccination.



AHVEC – Advantages

- Supplementary to educational resources that are available
- The AHVEC course will be a free online educational course
- Contents will be easy to understand and follow
- Developed in partnership with an experienced vaccination coordinator



AHVEC – Course Work

- Will rely on the same structure as the REC in order to ensure continuity within the GARC Education Platform
 - Entire course can be performed online OR
 - The course material can be downloaded and studied offline



AHVEC – Final Assessment

 Participants will pass the AHVEC course once passing a final assessment covering all the work included in the course material

 Participants will have two attempts at passing the final course and will require at least 85%

Various controlling/hand holding techniques are provided based on the size of the dog or cat.

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
Module 5: Vaccinating dogs

 Acknowledges that vaccination does not end once the vaccine has been administered

 Discusses how to release dogs safely based on the situation and that animal's behavior
